History Like You've Never Seen

Overlooking the Arkansas River, the commanding Drennen-Scott House was initially the home of early Arkansas settler, politician and entrepreneur John Drennen and his family. Owned and operated by the University of Arkansas-Fort Smith, the house is now a museum for the public and an educational site for students of all ages. The site is linked to the Trail of Tears, the Underground Railroad, and the Civil War. Built in 1838, the home was continuously occupied by the Drennen family until the property was acquired by the university in 2005. This sprawling single-story home and its contents are listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The interior of the home serves as a beautiful backdrop to the antebellum furniture, with highlights include a frieze displayed at the Arkansas House in the 1893 Chicago World's Fair, a grandfather clock dating to the 1740's, and a Steinway piano manufactured in 1860.



Additionally, UAFS has recently restored the Leonard Willhaf Home, an 1850's working class house that preserves the legacy of a German immigrant family and Leonard's bakery along with his military service. Steamboat captains, stagecoach passengers, elegant Victorian ladies and gentlemen, Native Americans making their way on the Trail of Tears; all have left footprints on Van Buren's historic Main Street and river walks.


Federal forces invaded during the Civil War, filling the streets with soldiers. Steamboats blazed on the river, and Van Buren was left a city uncertain of Union control. By 1876, when the first train pulled into Van Buren, the city was once again a thriving river town. The Crawford County Bank Building was the epitome of Victorian elegance when its doors opened in 1889.



The King Opera House, built in 1891,


